Sustainability at Malik Group is not managed as a separate function. It is embedded in how we make decisions, operate our business, and collaborate with partners. Our management systems, policies, and certifications provide a common framework that ensures consistency across all companies and locations.

Integrated Management System

We operate a fully integrated management system covering quality, environment, and occupational health and safety, certified under **ISO 9001, ISO 14001, and ISO 45001**. These systems help us identify risks, monitor performance, and drive continual improvement – ensuring that ESG objectives are not isolated goals but part of our operational discipline.

In addition, **Malik Energy A/S** holds **ISCC EU** and **ISCC Plus** certifications for the handling and delivery of sustainable marine fuels. These certifications document traceability and transparency throughout the value chain and support our clients' compliance with EU and IMO climate regulations.

Governance and Accountability

Our ESG efforts are anchored in Malik Group's governance structure. The Board of Directors oversees ESG progress and risk management, while the Compliance Department ensures adherence to laws, sanctions regimes, and internal policies across all activities.

This includes policies on anti-corruption, fair competition, modern slavery and trafficking, and whistleblowing, which collectively uphold ethical conduct and transparency in every business relationship.

ESG data, including environmental performance, safety indicators, and workforce metrics, is compiled and reviewed annually through our integrated reporting processes.

This ensures that management decisions are informed by accurate, comparable data.



Double materiality assesment

While the 2024 assessment primarily reflected internal perspectives, we have since expanded stakeholder engagement to include key customers, suppliers, and partners. This broader dialogue, initiated in 2025, will inform future reporting cycles and strengthen the relevance of our ESG priorities.

As this is our first ESG report, we have conducted a comprehensive Double Materiality Assessment (DMA) to identify and prioritise the issues that matter most - both to our business and to our stakeholders.

The concept recognises two perspectives:

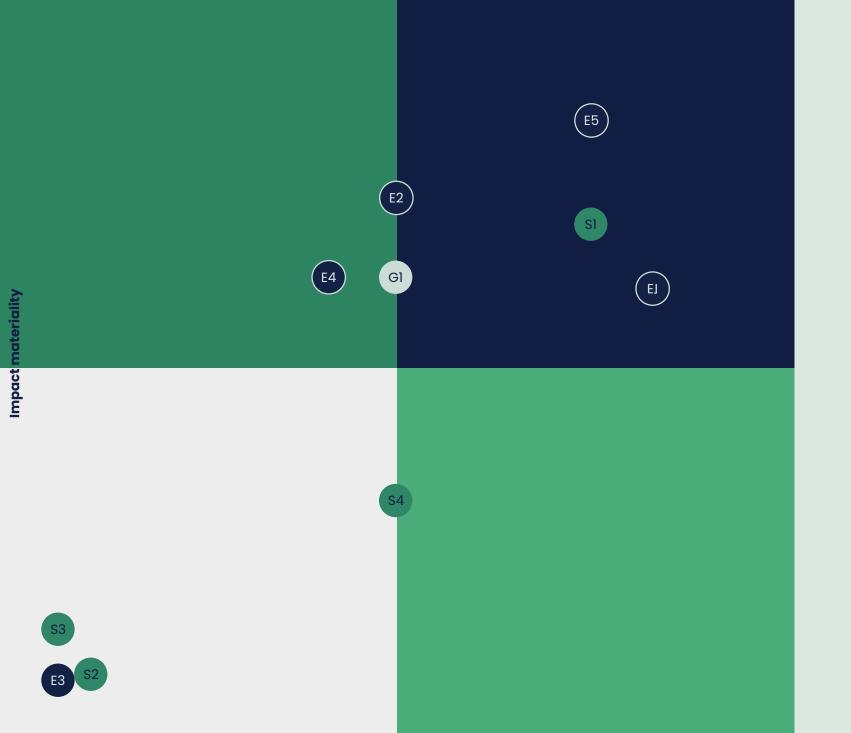
- Impact materiality (inside-out): how our operations, products, and services affect the environment, people, and society.
- Financial materiality (outside-in): how environmental, social, and governance factors influence Malik Group's business performance, risks, and opportunities.

This twofold approach ensures that our ESG focus reflects both our responsibilities and our long-term resilience.

The assessment was carried out internally across business units to identify and prioritise the ESG topics most relevant to our operations and industry context. The process involved three main steps:

- Internal review and input: collecting knowledge from teams across Malik Group to understand which ESG topics have the greatest operational and strategic significance.
- Risk and impact analysis: evaluating potential environmental, social, and governance impacts across our value chain, based on likelihood, severity, and business relevance.
- **3. Prioritisation:** mapping and ranking material topics according to their importance to Malik Group and their influence on business performance.

The outcome provides a clear foundation for our ESG strategy and targets. The horizontal axis of our materiality matrix reflects financial materiality, while the vertical axis represents impact materiality.

Our ESG Priorities

Our ESG framework builds on Malik Group's strengths as a service organisation – combining responsibility with reliability.

Across all areas, we focus on a few clear priorities:

- **Environment:** reducing emissions, preventing spills, and improving energy efficiency in our own operations and across our value chain.
- Social: maintaining a safe, healthy, and inclusive workplace that attracts and develops skilled employees.
- Governance: ensuring integrity, accountability, and compliance throughout our organisation and supply chain.

These priorities are informed by the Double Materiality Assessment and guide the targets and actions described in the following sections.

Our ESG approach evolves through learning, dialogue, and measurement. We actively engage with suppliers, clients, and partners such as **EcoVadis** to benchmark our progress and align with international standards. Preparing this report has strengthened our internal collaboration and data transparency, helping us refine our priorities and define clearer goals for the coming years.

Sustainability is not a static objective — it is an ongoing commitment to improve. Through shared responsibility, we continue to move Malik Group forward, beginning with the area where our impact and opportunities are most direct: the environment.

Our Environmental Responsibility and Direction

As part of the maritime energy sector, we recognise our responsibility to help reduce global greenhouse gas emissions. The shipping industry contributes a significant share of global CO2 emissions, and meaningful progress requires collaboration across the value chain.

We act on this responsibility by improving our own operations and by enabling our customers to decarbonise theirs. Through initiatives such as EcoBunkering, we reduce emissions from our own deliveries and offer cleaner solutions to our customers. At our terminals, we store three certified biofuel products and urea solutions that support lower-emission vessel operations. Our global trading teams continuously monitor developments to ensure that customers have access to efficient and responsible energy options worldwide.

Our environmental management system, certified under ISO 14001, provides the structure for identifying risks, ensuring compliance, and improving environmental performance. Together with our ISCC EU and ISCC Plus certifications, it ensures traceability and accountability throughout our operations and supply chain.

- Certified green electricity
- Power efficient light fixtures in all offices
- Optimizing HAVC system
- Environmentally friendly merchandise
- Training of employees in reducing electricity usage
- Waste management, garbage sorting and recycling pickup and dumpster rental.

Reducing emissions from our own operations (Scope 1)

We are committed to reducing greenhouse gas intensity from our own barge operations by 20 % by 2030.

The transition to biofuels in our fleet is central to achieving these reductions. Electrification of company cars and trucks is also progressing, supporting our broader Scope 1 and 2 reduction path, with a goal of 30 % lower CO2 per kilometre by 2030.

Efficient and responsible energy use (Scope 2)

We continue to improve energy efficiency across offices, terminals, and port operations through technical upgrades and the purchase of certified green electricity. In 2024, total electricity intensity improved to 0.879 kWh/m³ handled, a 2.6 % reduction compared to 2023.

Our goal is to maintain an intensity below 0.90 kWh/m³ by 2030 and ensure that at least 50 % of all purchased electricity is certified as green by 2030.

Value-chain impact and resource management (Scope 3)

Our Scope 3 work focuses on the areas where our activities influence emissions outside our direct operations. This includes transport and distribution carried out by partners, the treatment of waste generated through our activities, business travel, commuting, and the emissions associated with the use of the energy products we supply.

We continue to engage with partners on responsible energy solutions and encourage choices that support lower greenhouse-gas emissions where possible. We also promote responsible travel behaviour and support more sustainable commuting options.

EcoVadis Collaboration and Continuous Improvement

In 2024, we achieved a bronze EcoVadis rating, placing us among the top 35 % (84 percentile) of assessed companies globally. The rating reflects the strength of our sustainability management system across environment, labour and human rights, ethics, and sustainable procurement.

We are now working toward a silver rating (top 15 % / 85 + percentile) in 2025 by strengthening documentation, data transparency, and cooperation with clients and partners. Our collaboration with EcoVadis and key customers helps us advance shared ESG goals and verify progress through external assessment.

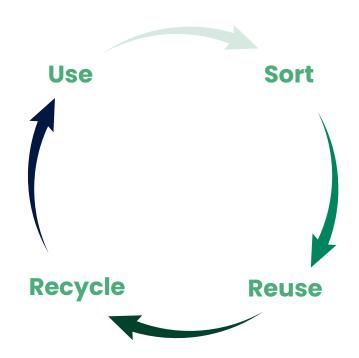

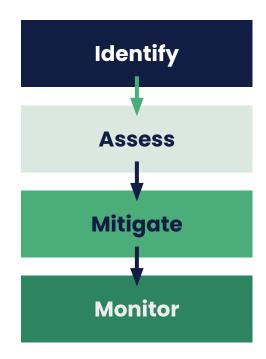

Climate-Related Risk Management

Climate considerations are integrated into our overall risk management framework. We assess physical and transition risks alongside financial and operational factors, with particular attention to regulatory developments, changing customer expectations, and potential weather impacts on terminals and transport infrastructure.

These risks are reviewed annually through our ISO 14001 system and overall risk register to ensure that mitigation measures support business continuity and long-term resilience.





Biodiversity and Ecosystems

We recognise the importance of protecting biodiversity and marine ecosystems. While our direct operational footprint is limited, we support industry efforts to reduce environmental impact through responsible product handling, safe waste management, and compliance with international standards.

Resource Use and Circular Practices

Resource efficiency and waste reduction are built into our daily operations. We sort and dispose of waste through approved recycling channels, and all employees are trained in responsible handling of products, packaging, and residual materials. We continue to identify new opportunities to reduce resource consumption and energy use across terminals and offices through process improvements and modern equipment.

Collaboration and Value-Chain Engagement

We work closely with suppliers and customers to promote lower-emission energy solutions and shared sustainability standards. Our ISCC-certified products, supplier screening process, and Supplier Code of Conduct form the foundation for responsible cooperation across the value chain.

Building on our 2024 experience, we are expanding this dialogue in 2025 through an ESG questionnaire initiative designed to deepen engagement and transparency with partners on their environmental and social performance.

Social

Introduction

Our people are at the heart of how we work and how we develop as an organisation. We take responsibility for creating a safe, fair, and inclusive workplace where everyone can thrive, contribute, and grow.

Our social responsibility reflects our values — Synergy, Professional, Observant, and Think New — and is supported by policies covering equality, work environment, recruitment, health and safety, and human rights. Together, these form a consistent framework for ethical and responsible conduct across the Group.

Our People and Culture

Our success relies on the people who make up Malik Group. Across offices, terminals, and vessels, we share a culture built on trust, professionalism, and collaboration. Our employees represent nine nationalities, and almost half have been with us for more than five years.

We regularly carry out workplace assessments (APV) to evaluate both physical and psychological working conditions. Findings are reviewed by management and health and safety representatives to identify areas for improvement. Employee satisfaction remained stable throughout 2024, with attendance rates exceeding 97 percent—reflecting strong engagement and commitment across the workforce. The overall satisfaction score reached 5.79 on a 7-point scale, indicating a high level of employee satisfaction.

Health, Safety and Well-being

Health and safety are essential parts of our responsibility and a key pillar of our ESG strategy. We work continuously to maintain a safe, healthy, and inclusive environment where employees can perform at their best while maintaining a sustainable work–life balance.

Our management system is certified under ISO 45001 and includes systematic risk assessments, incident reporting, and near-miss follow-up. All employees have the authority to stop work if conditions are unsafe, and performance is monitored closely to ensure learning and improvement.

We promote physical and social well-being through a range of initiatives, most importantly through healt insurance coverage for all employees. Employees can also join internal padel, cycling, running, and film clubs, and everyone has access to an on-site massage programme designed to prevent work-related strain. Our Service & Health Coordinator ensures access to healthy meals and supports well-being initiatives across the organisation.

We also place great importance on social events, held several times each year, which strengthen relationships across teams and reinforce our culture of trust and shared purpose.

Through these combined efforts, we aim to foster a strong sense of belonging, reduce absenteeism, and maintain a workplace where health, well-being, and performance go hand in hand.

Equality, Diversity and Inclusion

We believe that diversity and inclusion strengthen both collaboration and performance. Our Equality, Diversity & Inclusion Policy commits us to fair opportunities and balanced representation at all levels.

In 2024, 20.6 percent of our office employees were women, 3.2 percent identified as belonging to minority or vulnerable groups, and our workforce represented nine nationalities. Our long-term goal is for either gender to make up at least 40 percent of the organisation by 2035.

Our recruitment and leadership practices are designed to prevent bias and ensure equal access to opportunities, with progress reviewed annually.

Human Rights and Ethical Employment

Respect for human rights is fundamental to the way we operate. We have zero tolerance for discrimination, harassment, forced labour, or child labour.

Our expectations are defined in the Code of Conduct, Supplier Code of Conduct, and Modern Slavery and Trafficking Policy, which apply to employees, contractors, and business partners.

Concerns can be raised confidentially through our whistleblower system, managed by Hafnia Law, which ensures impartial handling and full protection from retaliation. This mechanism complements open dialogue and supports a transparent and responsible workplace culture.

Talent Recruitment and Development

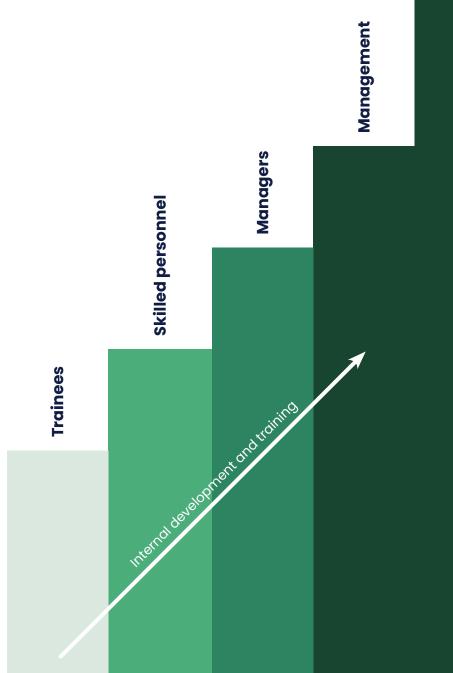

The Board oversees our strategic direction, risk management, and compliance, and reviews progress on ESG matters as part of the annual strategy process.

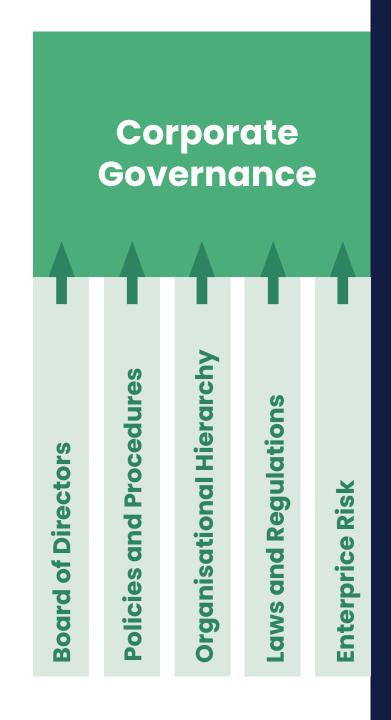
Executive Management, including the CEO, COO, CFO, CCO, and Compliance Officer, is responsible for day-to-day governance and for embedding our values and policies throughout the organisation.

Ethics and Compliance

We conduct our business in accordance with the highest ethical standards. We comply with all applicable laws and regulations and maintain a zero-tolerance approach to corruption, bribery, and discrimination.

Our compliance programme ensures that all employees understand their responsibilities through regular training and communication. We monitor compliance with sanctions, competition law, and anti-corruption rules across all operations and expect the same standards from our suppliers and business partners.

Employees can confidentially report serious concerns through our whistleblower channel, which is administered by an independent external law firm. We protect anyone who reports in good faith from retaliation.



ESG Oversight

ESG performance is coordinated by our ESG Task Force, overseen by the COO. The task force brings together representatives from Marketing, Finance, HSE & Marine, and a student position focused on ESG data and reporting.

This cross-functional group ensures consistency in data, supports initiatives across the organisation, and helps management set and follow up on sustainability targets.

Managing Risk

Risks are reviewed on a regular basis through our ISO-certified management systems and as part of Board and Executive Management discussions.

We manage risk proactively to protect our people, operations, and reputation. Financial risks, such as credit and market exposure, are monitored continuously, while non-financial risks – including compliance, environmental, and safety risks – are addressed through our management systems and internal controls.

Key risks and mitigation measures are reviewed by the Board and Executive Management each year as part of our strategic and audit processes.

Management Systems

We maintain certified management systems for quality (ISO 9001), environment (ISO 14001), and health and safety (ISO 45001). These systems help us monitor performance, identify improvements, and ensure compliance with international standards.



People and Culture

We believe good governance starts with a strong, respectful workplace culture. We promote diversity and inclusion, provide equal opportunities, and have zero tolerance for harassment or discrimination.

We are committed to protecting human rights and preventing modern slavery and human trafficking in our operations and supply chain. Training and clear procedures ensure that employees and suppliers understand and meet these expectations.

Safety and well-being are central to our way of working. We conduct regular workplace assessments and encourage everyone to contribute to a healthy and safe environment.

Data Protection and Transparency

We safeguard personal and operational data through secure systems, controlled access, and continuous monitoring. All employees complete annual IT and data protection training to ensure compliance with GDPR and cybersecurity standards.

We are committed to transparent reporting and continuous improvement. While this first ESG report has not been externally assured, we plan to introduce independent verification in future reporting cycles to further strengthen credibility and stakeholder trust.

The first leg of an important voyage

Preparing our first ESG report has been a valuable step in understanding our performance, clarifying our responsibilities, and setting a stronger direction for the years ahead. The process has given us a clearer picture of where we are well organised and where we need to strengthen our approach, particularly in relation to data quality and consistency. Some information presented in this report is based on data we have not previously collected in a structured manner, and this has highlighted natural gaps. We acknowledge these limitations openly, and they form part of our learning curve.

What matters most is that we have now established a framework that brings our environmental, social, and governance efforts together in one place. It supports the way we operate, aligns with our values, and helps us integrate ESG into daily decision-making rather than treating it as a stand-alone activity. It also confirms that many of the initiatives we rely on today — from ISO-certified management systems to our policies on safety, equality, compliance, and responsible energy solutions — already contribute to a structured ESG foundation.

This first report also reflects how important collaboration is to our progress. Internally, it has strengthened the coordination between teams. Externally, it has shown where we can work even more closely with customers, suppliers, and partners to reduce emissions, improve transparency, and support shared standards.

Looking ahead, 2025 will be a year of further development for our organisation. The opening of new offices in Sweden and new office facilities in Greece will place additional demands on our ESG work, particularly in relation to data management, alignment of procedures, and maintaining a consistent approach across locations. These steps broaden our operational footprint, and with that comes a responsibility to ensure that our ESG framework is applied uniformly and continues to mature as the organisation grows.

We are already underway with gathering more detailed and consistent ESG data for 2025. This includes expanding our value-chain dialogue, refining our scope 3 accounting, and strengthening our internal reporting routines. These steps will improve the quality of future reporting and help us track progress more precisely.

We view this report as a starting point. It gives us a baseline, a clearer direction, and a stronger commitment to continuous improvement. As we move forward, we will keep building on what we have learned and remain focused on responsible, reliable, and forward-looking solutions for maritime energy.







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
